The older traditions come up with at least three Saint Valentine figures over the years. No one really knows which one is the true Saint Valentine. The book of Acts obviously refers to saints as the body of believers gathered in Christ's name. Luke uses the term to define the early Christian church. It does sound a lot like FPC Hanford. We gather, struggle, take persecution and continue to press on, identifying ourselves with Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior.

For us February will remind us of a pastor who loved this congregation dearly. A pastor whose life was taken in a careless act of selfishness. It will remind us that we do struggle. Hopefully it will remind us that, while persecuted, we continue to press on, identifying ourselves with Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior.

This year as February comes rolling through, maybe we should start a campaign to take back Valentine's Day. We could title it, "Saints Valentine Day." The plural group being pushed and identified as believers in the love of God. The plural group who weathers persecution. The plural group united to bring Christ to a needy world.

Let's take back February, "For All The Saints." "For all the saints who from their labors rest, Who thee by faith before the world confessed, Thy name, O Jesus, be forever blest." Be blessed with me this February and discover true unending love from God, the true saints of Valentine's Day.

In January, our Deacons meeting was a special time to welcome the new class of Deacons (Laurie Essepian, Janet Harader, and Carley Watson) and to thank the outgoing class for their faithful service (Rowena Curiel, Sally Gordon and Laurie Essepian). We enjoyed a potluck dinner together before conducting the business of the meeting. Marj Froberg accepted the position of Moderator (Chairperson), the Deacon who conducts the meetings and provides leadership to our group. Martin Keast and Laurie Essepian (who is considered a 'new deacon' because she agreed to serve a second 3-year term) continue in their respective roles as Secretary and Treasurer.

As you may know, The Deacon Committee donates a portion of the designated financial gifts that are received each month to several charitable organizations in our community. Recently it has come to our attention that the "Meals on Wheels" program through the local nonprofit, Kings County Commission on Aging, is in need of additional funds. "Meals on Wheels" is a week's worth of frozen, nutritious lunches that are delivered each Monday to the elderly who are 60 years of age or older and at risk of malnutrition.

Meals are delivered to residents of all seven cities in Kings County. Staff works to maintain and assist participants, making sure their needs are met, as well as linking them with other community services from groups and individuals.

The recipients are asked to make a donation to cover the cost of the meals; however many of them are not able to do so. This service is enjoyed by several of our congregation's seniors, and some in our church volunteer as delivery drivers and helpers with the "Meals on Wheels" team. So in a sense, by helping to financially support this program, we are 'helping support our own.' Donations allow for the partial subsidization of those unable to afford the total cost of meals.

In the past, the Meals on Wheels were only delivered to those who were homebound, and others would go to a Nutrition Site to pick up their meals. Due to Covid-19, all of the recipients are getting home delivery, which has required a greater number of volunteer drivers.

We as Deacons have appreciated learning more about this valuable resource of "Meals on Wheels" in our county and wanted to share the opportunity to help meet this need with you. Feel free to ask a Deacon if you have further questions.

Several of our ministries are looking for members:




