Our staff – really your staff – Janice, Annette, Gwen, Sheri and I were looking ahead on the calendar. We realized that the summer slump may be on the horizon as June settles upon us. There may be fewer in worship as families set out on vacations. We suspend certain programs so there are fewer times of fellowship and gathering. Sometimes the slump is there just because it is so very hot here in the central valley, and we just don't feel like doing anything. What's a Christian to do? Well, I'm glad you asked, let's see what we can figure out.



- 1. So as you are getting ready to hit the road, visit family, or do a bit of travelling that might not bring you back home for a while, think about pre-paying your church pledge so there is not a slump in that part of the summer. (The finance committee made me say that.)
- 2. If you are away, make it a priority with your family to visit other churches and religious sites. You can prevent a summer slump for some other congregation by worshipping with them, and / or spending time in fellowship with them. Keep your eyes and ears open with the other congregations. If you see something, or hear something you like, make a note of it and bring it back to your staff so we can share good ideas and help this congregation grow and flourish.
- 3. You know that magic 4 P.M. to 9 P.M. they keep talking about, where they want you to save energy? What if, as church members we contacted each other and invited one another over so one house could not use the AC while the other one did? Energy efficiency, and fellowship with church family all at the same. This works for both young and old, or even cross the lines and have young invite old or old invite young. I suppose you could add a little Bible Study in if you like, but just gathering as the family of Christ is a great witness to others and helpful to upbuilding your faith.
- 4. What about just embracing the quiet? Enjoy the solitude. Let the less hectic summertime bring peace and calm to your soul. Sometimes it is wise to rest in the Lord so there is no summer slump, but just a summer of peace and quiet. Spend the summer looking for God's love in your life.

Summer Slump? I think not. Let's allow summer to be a time of growing deeper into our faith. Try something from above to grow your faith. Allow yourself the relaxation of summer and renewal of your commitment to Christ. Reach out in love – be, "A Fellowship of People Brought Together Through God's Prevenient Grace to Grow Closer to God."

The Shower Ministry is one of the causes the Deacons support. Many of you have donated toiletry items, which the shower ministry appreciates.

The Shower Ministry is run by the Pentecostal Church of God in Hanford. The showers are open on Thursdays from 7:30 am to 11:30 am. Clients who use the showers are either homeless or parolees. Toiletry items needed weekly are:

Bars of soap Shampoo Conditioner Towels

Toothpaste Toothbrushes

Combs Brushes

Personal hygiene products

There are also 6 beds for parolees in the trailer where the showers are located, and many of the clients have come to Christ and encourage others who get out of prison to join their church and learn about Christ.

Many have come from Celebrate Recovery, and give back to their community by helping others recover. They have coffee and cook meals together, giving each other a family in a community where they have been placed after being released from prison.

Thank you for your continued support of this ministry. There is a brown box in the fellowship hall where you can place toiletries.

FPC Vacation Bible School 2022 Mission Outreach

"Armona Refuge House"

The majority of youth in Armona are socioeconomically disadvantaged, which means the majority of homes have parents who often work multiple jobs, or are involved in drugs, alcohol, or gang activity. Several years ago, Armona school teachers, Aaron and Alyssa Hailey began to feel God's calling to do something in the community for the youth. They began an open gym program a few days a week after school, and that soon grew to over 100 children coming each time. God prompted them to look for a new location, and soon the "Armona Refuge House" was established.

They opened their doors in September 2020 in a home on the corner of 14th Avenue and Pimo Street in Armona. Here they are able to provide homework help, afterschool activities, and dinner to the children of their community. They even have started an AWANA program for their younger children. Their mission is to show the hope and love of Jesus to the children of their community.

This year, our First Presbyterian Church's Vacation Bible School program beginning on Monday June 27th has chosen to support the Armona Refuge House as a VBS Mission's project. Children attending our VBS program will be collecting donations of art and/or school supplies so that each child who attends VBS will have the opportunity to pack a special bag filled with art/school supplies for the children of Armona Refuge House. Armona Refuge House also has a need for large backpacks for their high school and middle school children. The VBS program is asking our congregation to consider helping by donating art or school supplies, and/or a backpack. 
