Dear FPC Family -

Have you ever been around people who seem to thrive on chaos? People who want to fight and argue because something at the root of their being is angry, or fearful, or maybe looking to get even? Sometimes I just sit in awe of people who can live like that – so much turmoil, so much wasted energy.

I remember starting a position at a new church and, the very first day, I was called to intervene in a household that was angry and on the verge of great violence. The typical tragedies were present: three small children confused and afraid; a couple who wanted to love each other but had only hatred in their eyes; family and friends trying to care and protect children and adults from each other; police officers feeling very inadequate to do anything except follow the law; and a pastor trying to bring peace in the name of Christ. Nicely enough, you know who won? Christ was the victor and peace has been restored.

Sometimes we think peacemaking means stopping the war in a far-off land, but more frequently Christians are called to bring peace to the world around them. That is our call for October. It begins as we share World Communion Sunday on October 5. With Christians around the globe, we will gather at the Lord's Table to be equipped for the sending.

In New Testament scripture, "peacemakers" appears twice. We all know the passage from the beatitudes where the peacemakers are called blessed because they will be the children of God. The word, "peace" comes through the New Testament at least a hundred times. One of the nice things is that you and I can bestow peace; called down from heaven given to another. You can sow peace and harvest righteousness. Did you know you had that kind of power?

Take a moment and think what it is you might do to promote peace during October. Is there a person in your household whose life is in chaos? Someone who has frustration, maybe anger, maybe insecurity? Just your very presence grounded in Christ and lead by God's Holy Spirit may bring peace to that life. You don't have to do anything – don't talk, just listen; be a gentle, non-anxious, Spirit filled Christian walking alongside the life in need and sharing the journey. Maybe it's in your neighborhood or extended family where the power of your presence may bring peace. Take a look, where can you be a peacemaker – in your home or in a far-off land if on deployment with the military, be the children of God; be blessed and be a blessing in peace.

# Compassion International Sunday October 17, 2021

Compassion International is a Three-Cord Approach to Ministry:

- 1) It is Christ Centered Compassion International helps the poorest of the poor, the children in greatest need, without ulterior motive because Compassion International is a "love thy neighbor" ministry. Jesus' life and teachings shape their programs and guide all aspects of their ministry. From how they work to how they treat people, respect communities and cooperate with nations, their response to a world filled with hundreds of millions of children living in extreme poverty is to love like Jesus did.
- 2) Is Church Driven Local churches are catalysts for community change, optimizing the mutual respect, resources and common purpose critical in caring for children in poverty. A local church is best suited to address the needs of the children in its community because the church is already located in and involved in the community. Only the local church can effectively deliver the Jesus-based teaching and whole-life care that children in poverty deserve.
- 3) Child-Focused When a child is registered in Compassion International's Child Sponsorship Program, the beneficiary is the specific sponsored child. Siblings, parents, and other caregivers may receive additional or indirect benefits from the programs, but the focus is the one child.

Child development means each child assisted by Compassion International's church partners receives whole-life care that is personal, individualized, relational, and tailored to the child's age, gender, health, culture and family situation. Compassion's focus on children involves a commitment to long-term involvement in a child's life.
