What comes to mind when you hear the word thanksgiving? Turkey? Pilgrims and Indians? No School? These are all correct answers, but what about thanksgiving in the Bible? The idea of giving thanks is found in all areas of Scripture, in both the old and new testaments. 1 Chronicles 16:34 says to "Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; His love endures forever." The psalmist talks about giving thanks: Psalm 9:1 "I will give thanks to you Lord with all my heart" and Psalm 107:8 "Let them give thanks to the Lord for his unfailing love and wonderful deeds."

The biblical idea of thanksgiving is not a once a year occurrence, rather it is a regular expression of praise, a way of life. Is this true in our lives? Do we regularly give thanks to God for what he has done? An expression of thanksgiving to God should flow from us regularly. It's more than just gratitude for what He does for us, it is a true praising and thankfulness for each and every day we have. Jeremiah 30:19 says "From them will come songs of thanksgiving and the sound of rejoicing." True thanksgiving causes joyful shouting, singing, and praising God.

The act of thanksgiving in the Bible goes beyond our selfishness. We are always asked around this time what WE are thankful for, how WE have shown gratitude and thanks to others. The Bible tells us that true thanksgiving is not for us, 2 Corinthians 4:15 says "that the grace that is reaching more and more people may cause thanksgiving to overflow to the glory of God" and 9:11 says "you will be enriched in every way so that you can be generous on every occasion, and through us your generosity will result in thanksgiving to God."

We are called to give of ourselves, of our time, of our money with joy and gladness. The Bible reminds us that we are enriched so that we can be generous in our offering and our praise to God. God will then take our joyful giving and in turn bless others. However, we are not only called to give thanks joyfully when things are going well. 1 Thessalonian 5:18 says "Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." Sure it's easy to be thankful and grateful and joyful when things are going well, but what about when tragedy strikes?

We at First Presbyterian Church are learning first-hand what it means to give thanks to God in ALL circumstances. We give thanks to God that Pastor Tony is still alive. We give thanks to God for each day he gains strength. We give thanks to God that Sheri is able to be by his side. We give thanks to God for each of you that has supported the Winterowd family and our church family.

As this month of thanksgiving begins I challenge each of us to seek God, to thank him with all our hearts, to sing songs of praise and thanksgiving, that this may cause gratitude and thanksgiving to overflow in all areas of our lives blessing and enriching the lives of all those around us. I pray that we continue to give thanks to God in ALL circumstances and that we would be an example to the world around us as to what true biblical thanksgiving is.

Summary of the October 15, 2019 Session Meeting

<u>Deacons</u>: • Deacons reported that some "Shut-Ins" have requested communion. Session approved for current Elders to provide communion.

Finance: • Giving is greatly reduced this year and FPC is operating with a deficit of over \$16,000.00. • Tentative budgets were distributed to committee chairs with requests to incorporate reductions in spending for 2020. Should the current deficit be overcome, previously planned budgets could be restored and requested cuts may be avoided. • Anonymous donors have agreed to pledge \$9,000 towards a "matching challenge." They will match dollar-for-dollar any contributions to the FPC general fund that are in addition to your regular tithe.

<u>Buildings & Grounds</u>: • Approved repairs to the ceiling in the Outreach Building using designated funds. • Approved repairs to the trusses in the C.E. Building using designated funds.

<u>Church Growth</u>: ● Three parking stalls will be designated for "Visitor" by painting the curb stops and erecting signs using donated funds.

Other Session Business: • Discussions regarding moving to a single-blended service are being heard and options are being discussed. These discussions have been prompted by some congregation member's suggestions. Session is interested in hearing all of your opinions.

A Message From Your Missions Ministry Team

Missionaries Jeff & Christi Boyd

Missionaries Jeff and Christi Boyd work hard in their respective areas! Christi works in four French-speaking African countries — Congo, Madagascar, Niger and Rwanda — and the non-French-speaking country of South Sudan. She accompanies global partners as they seek to remedy the marginalization of women and children in their communities, and she engages with Presbyterian constituencies in the U.S. that wish to come alongside and promote those efforts. Christi fosters relationships with U.S. Presbyterians aimed at furthering the interests of women and children.

As regional liaison for Central Africa, Jeff Boyd facilitates support for the relationships, programs and activities of partners in the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Cameroon, and Equatorial Guinea. He also resources mission personnel and helps connect partner churches with U.S. congregations that want to be involved in ministry in the region.

Most of the countries where Christi and Jeff work are rich in natural resources, but only a small and powerful segment of the population benefits from the revenues they produce. In fact, poverty is rampant, educational access is limited, and disease is widespread. The wealth created by the abundant natural resources often fuels regional conflicts that exacerbate the vulnerability of women and children to cultural and gender-based violence. The Presbyterian Church works with partners in all seven countries to address these challenges. Congo, Cameroon, Rwanda, South Sudan and Madagascar have large and growing Presbyterian/Reformed churches. The Reformed presence is much smaller in Equatorial Guinea, which is predominately Roman Catholic, and Niger, which is mostly Muslim.

Having completed 13 years as facilitator for the "Joining Hands" Initiative in Cameroon, Christi has particular expertise in building bridges of solidarity that connect people to tackle problems of a globalizing world. Christi's efforts on behalf of the marginalized are rooted firmly in her faith. "Through the words of Jesus and the prophets, God consistently defends the cause of the poor, vulnerable and oppressed," she says. "The Scriptures call us to follow in their footsteps."

Since arriving in Africa in 1990, the Jeff and Christi have lived in Tanzania and Cameroon, and they are now in Congo for the second time. As Christi puts it, "We discerned that the Author of all good things indeed had not yet finished the Congo chapter of our life in mission service." Jeff and Christi feel a strong call to serve in Africa. "We feel this is where God wants us at this time," Jeff says. "Christi and I are both constantly challenged in our work. There remains so much to learn and work on."

We are thankful for the work that Jeff and Christi are doing; please keep them in prayer as they continue their service in Africa!
