The Gift That Will Not Be Returned! By Sue Kinney



On Sunday November 7th, First Presbyterian Church had its Annual Operation Christmas Child Packing Party after worship service. A year of planning and coordination by the Mission Ministry Team all coming to a close as congregation members came together to fill boxes with school supplies, hygiene items, clothing, toys and stuffed animals. Tables were stocked to the brim with items to ensure that each box being packed would be full of surprises and gifts for the children across the world to receive. Each box included a hand written note telling the recipient child that God loves them!

On Sunday, November 21st, all the shoeboxes were dedicated and presented before the Lord during worship service before being transported to the pickup location in Hanford. From there they were transported to the Operation Christmas Child Processing Center in Fullerton. Once at the Processing Center, hundreds of volunteers came together to inspect and prepare the boxes for the final shipment to children across the world! Mission Ministry Team members, Dottie and Jeff Crass, Regional Coordinators for OCC, and Janet Harader, once again worked at the Processing Center as an outreach mission experience.

Upon final processing at the Center, the shoeboxes leave for shipment to various locations across the world where Samaritan's Purse partners with a volunteer National Leadership Team that consists of year-round volunteers from various church denominations and equips their ministry partners, pastors and church leaders, to be the volunteer representatives. The local ministry partners distribute the shoeboxes to children in their communities – to many children who may never have received a gift before! After receiving shoebox gifts, the children are invited to enroll in "The Greatest Journey", a discipleship program that introduces the children to Salvation through faith in Jesus Christ and encourages them and their families to grow as faithful followers.

OUR MONEY STORY - During this season we are reminded that our giving to the Lord's work demonstrates that we recognize God's sovereignty and that we put our needs second out of obedience to Him. The power of your gift of kindness is that you give others hope.

Please consider the following in determining your faith commitment for 2022: Begin with prayer. If you are already tithing, consider if God is calling you to give joyfully beyond that level; EPC Askings are \$38 per member; If last year's giving is not a tithe, consider a budget plan to move to a tithe over time; perhaps an increase of just 2% of your income. Our Faith Commitments received as of November 28th total \$86,496.00. This is 30% of the faith commitments we need to meet our budget next year.
